



Position Description – Team Coach

The role of the Team Coach is to create a cohesive environment that allows team members, collectively and individually to develop skills to the best of their ability in the game of volleyball.

Desirable Attributes:

The Team Coach should:

- be or be working towards being an accredited coach within Volleyball WA
- be a person who can develop good relationships internally and externally
- be forward thinking and committed to meeting the goals of the Team and the Club
- be a good listener and attuned to the interests of players
- be a good role model and a positive image in representing the Club
- be able to raise concerns with the Coaching Coordinator where they arise

Specific duties include but are not limited to:

- Ensure all welfare and safety requirements for the team are met at all times.
- Assess strengths and weaknesses in a participant's performance and identifying areas for further development.
- Communicate instructions and commands using clear, simple language.
- Demonstrate an activity by breaking the task down into a sequence.
- Encourage participants to gain and develop skills, knowledge and techniques.
- Ensure that participants train and perform to a high standard at all times.
- Inspire confidence and self-belief.
- Adapt to the needs and interests of group or individual participants.
- Plan programmes of activities for groups and/or individuals.
- Attend Coaches meetings.
- Submit a match report to the Social Media Officer no later than 48hrs after completion of match day.
- Maintaining records of participant performance.
- Ensure that all players are registered to play and follow instruction of Club Secretary in relation non-viable players; failure to do so may result in the loss of Coaches fees.
- Be responsible for team selection and player rotation
- Comply with the VWA Code of Conduct at all times
- Abide by the Volleyball WA Competition By Laws at all times
- Conform to the appropriate dress standards for competition and umpiring.
